HEALTHY CONGREGATION PROGRAMS

Provides leadership in understanding how the congregation functions as a LIVING SYSTEM, as a whole with many parts, struggling to maintain life balance. Church health promoting alternatives are explored.

BRIDGE BUILDER PROCESS

Understanding that congregations are emotional systems, support is provided in appreciating and/or affirming church identity, in recognizing stumbling blocks and in elimination of them toward growth movement.

COACHING

Provides one-on-one interactive experiences to help pastors/lay leaders identify and/or accomplish ministry related goals.

COMMUNICATION SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Underscores common practices that undercut effective communication and provides model/exercises helpful in improved communication skill development.

DIAGNOSIS

Aids in careful evaluation and analysis of church life as an organizational social entity.

FACILITATED DISCUSSIONS

Strengthens intra-church communications, particularly on issues relative to the life of the church through facilitated discussion.

MEDIATION

Aims at bridging the gap, and/or reconciling opposing sentiments on matters that pertain to congregational life.
